Family Educational Rights and Privacy act

Federal regulations are in effect governing students' records. The register is published by the United States Dept. of Education. If you desire more information, please contact the Superintendent at 208-843-2622.

Student Directory Information: At times during the school year, legitimate requests are made by agencies such as parent groups or armed forces to obtain lists of students' names and addresses. By law, schools need to comply with these requests. However, individuals have the right to withhold the information. If you do not want the school to release your child's name and address, please contact your children's school principal. This must be done annually.

Electric Scooters and Motorized Devices

For the safety of all students, the use or possession of electronic scooters and other personal motorized transportation devices is strongly discouraged on school grounds. These devices present significant safety concerns due to limited supervision, the age of students, and increased traffic around school entrances and dismissal areas.

On arrival to school grounds, personal motorized transportation devices must be walked or carried. This expectation is in place to help ensure safe arrival and dismissal procedures and to protect all students, staff, and families. Personal transportation devices are not permitted inside the school building and must be stored outside in an appropriate location. The school is not responsible for devices that are lost, stolen, or damaged while on school property. Students who operate electronic scooters or other personal motorized transportation in an unsafe or inappropriate manner will be prohibited from bringing these devices onto school grounds.

Volunteer Procedures

Lapwai Schools welcome volunteers to assist with instructional activities. Volunteers should contact the principal at the school they would like to assist. Board policy requires approval of all volunteers. Conditional approval may be obtained from the principal or superintendent. Volunteers will be required to undergo a fingerprint and background check through the Idaho Department of Education.

Minute of Silence

Idaho Code requires 60 seconds of silence for all grade levels in all schools at or near the beginning of each school day. During this minute, students may sit quietly or engage in any silent activity permitted by school rules and District policy provided the activity does not distract or interfere with other students. Staff shall not direct students regarding the nature of any reflection the students may choose to engage in during this time. Each year the District shall provide notice to parents/guardians informing them the District observes this minute of silence and directing parents/guardians to provide guidance to their children regarding the minute of silence. Please contact your child's Principal or the Superintendent with questions.



Child Find Notice

Lapwai School District #341 is committed to ensuring that every child receives the support needed to learn and thrive. The district has an ongoing responsibility to locate, identify, and evaluate children ages 3 through 21 who may have a disability and may need special education or related services.

Child Find applies to children who reside within district boundaries, as well as children who attend a private or religious school located within the district. This includes children attending public school, private school, or homeschool; children experiencing homelessness or temporary housing; migrant and highly mobile children; and children who are advancing from grade to grade but may still have a disability.

As part of our Child Find efforts, Lapwai School District conducts an annual screening for preschool-age children at the Nez Perce Tribe's Mamáy'asnim Hitéemenwees, or Children's Place of Learning, Head Start program. The screening helps identify children who may benefit from additional developmental support or a comprehensive evaluation. Screening results do not determine special education eligibility. If concerns are identified, families will be contacted, and written parent or guardian consent will be obtained before an initial evaluation is conducted.

Concerns may involve learning, communication, hearing, vision, motor development, health, behavior, social-emotional development, or daily living skills. Parents, guardians, educators, service providers, and community members may make a referral. Screenings and evaluations are provided at no cost to families.
