Dear Lapwai Students and Parents:

In preparation for the coming school year, please assist us with making regular and punctual attendance a priority with all students. Absent students miss valuable learning, leaving them far behind their peers. Exclusive of school-scheduled activities, a student may only miss 12 days per semester. Failure to meet this standard will result in "no credit" or "withdrawal" on the student transcript. Attendance also now impacts athletic eligibility. With the exception of absences which include a written doctor's excuse, student athletes exceeding 12 absences will be ineligible for continued participation that semester.

ATHLETIC PHYSICALS


All new students, and 7th, 9th, and 11th graders have to have a physical turned in or uploaded to registermyathlete.com in order to participate.

CHILD FIND

The Lapwai School District would like to take this opportunity to notify our community of Child Find activities. We

would like to make sure we help all children get the services they need.



The school district has a special education screening program to locate and screen all children with suspected disabilities who are residents of the district and who have not graduated from high school. Upon request the school district will screen any resident child who has not graduated high school determine whether a special education referral is appropriate. When school staff reasonably believes a child is a child with a disability, they refer the child for evaluation by a school district Individualized Education Program (IEP) team.

In addition, if you have a child between the ages of 3-5, the Lapwai School District and the Nez Perce Tribe Head Start Program will be providing a joint developmental screening in September. Each child's motor, communication; and social skills are observed at various play areas. Each child's hearing is checked and information is provided on vision assessments. The information is used to provide the parent with a profile of their child's current development and to suggestions for follow-up provide The information from activities. screening is also used to determine whether a child should be evaluated for a suspected disability.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to report the child to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the

referral will be made. The referral must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. Others who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child to the school district in which the child resides.

A referral of a child residing in the Lapwai School District may be sent to Lori Ravet, Special Education Director and School Psychologist, at 404 South Main Street, Lapwai, ID 83540, or by email lravet@lapwai.org, or by phone at Middle/High School 208-843-2241 or Elementary School 208-843-2960.

Any information you provide regarding a child will be confidential as required by local, state and federal law.

PUBLIC MEETINGS

Regularly scheduled meetings of the Board of Trustees for the Lapwai School District #341 are held on the third Monday of each month at 5:00pm in the District Office. If you would like to address the board on a particular concern, please contact Dr. David Aiken at the district office to be scheduled on the agenda. These meetings are also an opportunity

to discuss the Impact Aid and the Indian Policy and procedures.

TRANSPORTATION

Routes will remain basically the same. Pickup and drop off times are tentative at this time. Firm times will be established at the beginning of school as student load dictates. Questions should be directed to Dan Swearingen, Transportation Director at 843-2681.

STUDENT INJURIES

Even with the greatest precautions and the closest supervision, accidents can and do happen at school. They are an act of life and part of the growing-up process our children go through. Parents need to be aware of this and be prepared for possible medical expenses that may arise should their child be injured at school. The school district does not provide medical insurance to automatically pay medical expenses when students are injured at school. This is the responsibility of the parents or legal quardians. The district carries only legal liability insurance. The district does make student medical insurance available to families for their individual purchase which can be access online at www.specialmarkets.com or 1-800-727-7642.

ASBESTOS

All asbestos-containing materials in buildings owned and/or operated by the Lapwai School District are in good condition and will continue to be managed in-place as recommended by the accredited AHERA Management Each school has their Planner. perspective AHERA Management Plans located in their administrative offices. Everyone is welcome to view this plan during normal school hours, Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. The AHERA Designated person, Alan

SCHOOL FACILITY RENTAL

All requests must be made a minimum of one week in advance. The Facilities Use Agreement and fees can be found at www.lapwai.org or at the District Office, located at 404 S. Main. The rental agreement will included proof of insurance.

VOLUNTEER PROCEDURE

Lapwai Schools welcome volunteers to assist with instructional activities. Volunteers should contact the principal at the respective school they would like to assist. Board policy requires approval of all volunteers. Conditional approval may be obtained from the principal or superintendent. Volunteers will be required to undergo the fingerprint and background check through the Idaho Department of Education.

STUDENT DIRECTORY INFORMATION

At times during the school year legitimate requests are made by agencies such as parent groups or armed forces to obtain lists of student's names and addresses. By law schools need to comply with these requests. However, individuals have the right to withhold that information. If you do not want the school to release your child's' name and address, please contact your Children School Principal. This must be done annually.

Sex Offenders

State law prohibits a sex offender from:

- 1. Being on or remaining on the premises of a school building or school grounds, or upon other properties posted with a notice that they are used by a school, when the person believes children under the age of 18 years are present and involved in a school activity or when children are present within 30 minutes before or after a scheduled school activity.
- 2. Loitering on a public way within 500 feet of the property line of school grounds or a school building when children under the age of 18 years are present for a school activity, or when students are present 30 minutes before or after such activity.
- 3. Being in any vehicle owned, leased, or contracted by a school to transport students to or from school or school-related activities when children under the age of 18 years are present in the vehicle.
- 4. Residing within 500 feet of a school, measured from the nearest point of the exterior wall of the offender's dwelling unit to the school property line, unless the person's residence was established prior to July 1, 2006

Important Lapwai School District Attendance Policy Information

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Thank you for your partnership in ensuring regular and punctual attendance. Not only do absent students miss valuable learning, average daily attendance drives our funding. Despite early release each Friday, these days will remain crucial to your child's education. Absences on Fridays will not only impact our funding, these students will be at a disadvantage and behind in their learning. Please join us in this effort to ensure all students reach their full potential.

The Lapwai School District has partnered with Nez Perce Tribe Prosecution to form a District Attendance Committee. The purpose of the Lapwai School District Attendance Committee is to surround families with support and resources to ensure regular and punctual attendance. The attendance committee process is non-punitive. In fact, the program is designed to prevent consequences for students and families. Participation is also not mandatory.

Idaho state law and the Nez Perce Tribal code require attendance at school. Students who do not comply with this regulation may be subject to school discipline and/or court action and referral to Child Protective Services including:

- 1. When a student has three (3) absences in a semester, a letter will be sent home. The letter will include the number of school days missed.
- 2. When a student reaches five (5) days of absences in a month or six (6) days of absences in a semester, the principal will notify the superintendent. The principal will contact the parent/guardian to develop a plan to assure regular attendance to minimize further absences and explain policies for attendance.
- 3. If attendance fails to immediately improve, the superintendent may contact the parent/guardian to arrange a referral to the Lapwai School District Attendance Court.
- 4. If such action is not successful, the student and/or parent may be charged with a violation of the Truancy Code in the appropriate jurisdiction.
- 5. When a student has missed ten (10) days in a semester, the student may be referred to Child Protective Services for educational neglect.
- 6. Exclusive of school-scheduled activities, a student may only miss twelve (12) days per semester. Failure to meet this standard will result in "no credit" or "withdrawal" on the student transcript.
- 7. If the above efforts fail to improve attendance, the principal will refer the student to the superintendent. After reviewing the student's attendance record, the superintendent may arrange a hearing before the Board of Trustees in accordance with Idaho Code 33-205, Denial of School Attendance, for habitual truancy. This hearing may lead to an expulsion for one calendar year, 365 days.

It is the responsibility of parents and guardians to ensure students attend school regularly and on time, yet please do not hesitate to contact us if we can provide support.
