LAPWAI SCHOOL DISTRICT #341 School Board Minutes Regular Meeting

September 21, 2017

The Board of Trustees of School District #341 met in regular session in the Board Room of the District Office. Board Chair Samuels-Allen called the meeting to order at 5:19 p.m. The board then led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll Call was made, present were Trustees Samuels-Allen, Bell, and Kipp. Trustee Johnson was absent. The audience included Teri Wagner, Lori Ravet, D'Lisa Penney-Pinkham, and David Kronemann. Prior to the start of the meeting with a quorum, also present were Valerie Ridinger, Melissa Tabor, and Ken Kessler who left after their presentation.

After a few questions, Trustee Kipp moved and Trustee Bell seconded that the consent agenda be approved as presented. The consent agenda included meeting minutes, payment of bills as presented, budget report, balance sheet, and ASB accounts. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

The discussion item of Native Education Research Summit Presentation was held before a quorum was present. Valerie Ridinger, Melissa Tabor, and Ken Kessler reviewed their activities in this area.

Principal Wagner answered a few questions but otherwise let her report stand as presented.

LEASE for CITY PARK and SKATE PARK PROPERTIES

between THE CITY OF LAPWAI and the LAPWAI SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 341

WHEREAS THE CITY OF LAPWAI ("CITY"), a political subdivision and municipal corporation of the State of Idaho is authorized to lease real property for City purposes, pursuant to Idaho Code§ 50-301.

WHEREAS, LAPWAI SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 341 ("SCHOOL"), has in the past and desires to lease and/or continue to lease to CITY, certain property for public and recreational use by CITY.

WHEREAS, CITY desires to use, and/or continue to utilize said property for public and recreational use.

THEREFORE, the LAPWAI SCHOOL DISTRICT, acting by and through its BOARD OF TRUSTEES, for and in consideration of one dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration, and the CITY OF LAPWAI ("PARTIES") hereby mutually undertake, promise and agree each for itself and its successors and assigns as follows:

1. **PROPERTY**. The following two (2) real estate parcels are the subject of this Lease and are hereinafter collectively referred to as "PROPERTY".

A. CITY PARK PARCEL. SCHOOL hereby leases to CITY and CITY hereby leases from SCHOOL certain real property commonly known as Lapwai City Park, Nez Perce County Tax Assessor's Parcel Number 405, and more specifically described as follows:

The following described real property located in Nez Perce County, State of Idaho, to wit:

A parcel of land situate in the Southwest ¼ of Section 2, Township 35 North, Range 4 West, Boise Meridian, Nez Perce County, State of Idaho, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at a found 5/8" diameter rebar located at the intersection of centerlines of South Main Street and Willow Avenue, said point marking the Northeast corner of Government Lot 27; thence South 00°14'59" East a distance of 659.79 feet to a found 5/8" diameter rebar marking the Southwest corner of that parcel described in Warranty Deed 494685; thence North 89°51'07" East, along the south boundary of that parcel described in Warranty Deed 494685, a distance of 148.82 feet to the TRUE POINT OF **BEGINNING**; thence North 89°51'07" East, along the south boundary of that parcel described in Warranty Deed 494685, a distance of 147.41 feet to the Southeast corner of the herein described lease parcel; thence North 00°14'58" West a distance of 67.07 feet to the Northeast corner of the herein described lease parcel; thence South 89°57'50" West a distance of 226.00 feet to the Northwest corner of the herein described lease parcel; thence 59.94 feet along 210 foot radius to the left, with a chord bearing of South 46°02'17" East and a chord length of 59.34 feet, to a point; thence South 54°09'37" East a distance of 44.61 feet to the Southwest corner of the herein described parcel and the TRUE POINT OF BEGINNING.

- 2. **TERM and TERMINATION**. The LEASE TERM shall commence on the date signed by both the CITY and the SCHOOL, and shall continue for fifty (50) years from that date. CITY may terminate this Lease upon 90 day's written notice to SCHOOL. Given the CITY's anticipated investment in the property, this Lease is not terminable at will by SCHOOL prior to the expiration of the LEASE TERM.
- 3. **PREVIOUS IMPROVEMENTS**. CITY hereby accepts the PROPERTY from SCHOOL, in its present "as is" condition. CITY has invested in certain park equipment, skate park development, drainage, infrastructure and maintenance in PROPERTY and CITY shall be responsible to pay for and maintain any alterations, additions or improvements, which may be removed by CITY prior to the expiration of this LEASE. Any property not removed at the expiration of this LEASE shall become the property of the SCHOOL.
- 4. **PAYMENT OF UTILITIES AND MAINTENANCE**. CITY hereby agrees to pay for utilities, maintenance, grounds and upkeep of the real property and improvements to the real property.

- 5. **WASTE**. CITY shall neither commit nor permit waste upon the PROPERTY, and agrees not to use, store or deposit in, on or about the PROPERTY any substance that is hazardous or dangerous to persons, property or the environment per applicable state or federal law or regulation, in amounts exceeding legally permissible levels.
- 6. **MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL**. The PROPERTY shall be subject to the exclusive control and management of the CITY. CITY shall have the right to establish, modify, amend and enforce policies, procedures, ordinances and regulations in its discretion, for the maintenance and use of the PROPERTY. CITY shall have the exclusive right to modify, repair and improve the PROPERTY, to construct improvements of whatever public nature, including bathrooms, skate parks, drainage, park, exercise and other public infrastructure and improvements.
- 7. **INDEMNIFICATION**. CITY and SCHOOL shall each insure against their own liabilities associated with the ownership interests and use of the property. CITY and SCHOOL shall each indemnify and hold harmless the other, for their own actions.
- 8. **QUIET ENJOYMENT**. SCHOOL covenants and agrees that CITY shall peaceably and quietly hold and enjoy the PROPERTY for CITY's purposes for the term of this lease, without hindrance or interruption. If any provision is determined to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the LEASE to the extent practicable, shall not be affected thereby.

All previous and contemporaneous communications, representations, or agreements, either verbal or written, between the Parties are superseded by this LEASE.
- 14. **SURVIVAL**. All covenants, conditions, indemnifications, and other elements in this LEASE that might involve performance subsequent to any termination or expiration of this LEASE or that cannot be reasonably ascertained or fully performed until after termination or expiration of this LEASE shall survive.
- 15. **MODIFICATIONS**. This LEASE may be modified or amended only by a writing duly executed by both Parties.
- 16. **PERFORMANCE/WAIVER**. The failure of a Party hereto to insist upon strict performance or observance of the terms of this LEASE shall not be a waiver of any breach of any terms or conditions of this LEASE by the other Party.
- 17. **THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES**. Nothing contained herein shall create any relationship, contractual or otherwise, with, or any rights in favor of, any third party. Nothing contained herein shall extend the liability of either Party beyond that provided by governing law.
- 18. **ATTORNEY FEES**. In the event a controversy, claim, or action arises between the Parties to this Lease regarding the enforcement of its terms and conditions, or the breach of any of its provisions, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to recover from the other Party all costs and expenses incurred by the prevailing Party, including reasonable attorney fees, regardless of whether such controversy, claim, or action is prosecuted to judgment or appealed.
- 19. **PUBLIC RECORDS**. The Parties herein understand and acknowledge that this Lease and its attachments are subject to the Idaho Public Records Act, I.C. §§ 74-101, *et seq.*, the Idaho Open Meetings Act, I.C. §§ 74-201, *et seq.*, and other applicable federal and state laws, and might be public records.

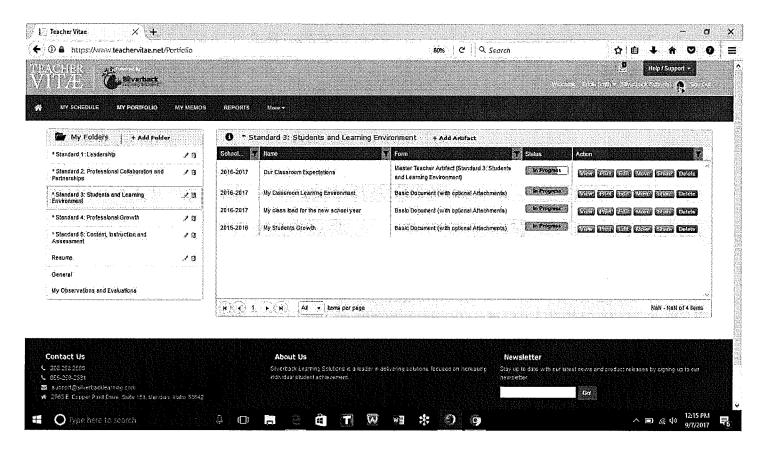

2018 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

Adopted: Draft

The IASA Board of Directors supports legislation that results in efforts to:

- Support a thorough, equitable, and uniform system of school funding, including special populations.
- b. Increase operational funding to address the current costs of health care premiums, transportation, utilities, and plant facility maintenance.
- c. Fully implement career ladder funding to improve recruitment and retention of effective and dedicated teachers, administrators, and pupil personnel.

The Lapwai School District appreciates your time on Tuesday, September 26th to discuss the importance of Impact Aid. Kate, thank you for accommodating us. The Congressman is very fortunate to have you on his team. Thank you for sharing this letter with him and our thanks for his continued support of this critical funding.

While making up for the shortfalls in state education funding, we are unable to rely on supplemental levies (raising property taxes) due to the high presence of tax exempt trust property in our district. The federal government recognizes their role in this dilemma and provides revenue in lieu of property taxes through the Impact Aid program. The purpose is to provide formula grants to school districts affected by the presence of nontaxable federal land to make up for the lost revenues of property taxes. Our impact aid allocation is based on the number of children who live on tax exempt trust property as well as parents who work on trust land.

Impact Aid is approximately 31% of our operating budget. Although the proposed raises from both the House and the Senate are greatly appreciated, we are currently only receiving 8.5 cents for every dollar we would receive if the program were fully supported. In FY13, all discretionary programs were cut by 5% as part of sequestration. This could only be described as devastating to the Lapwai School District resulting in a \$450,000 reduction in Impact Aid Funding. These cuts forced our district to attempt two back-to-back unsuccessful supplemental levies creating political turmoil where property taxes primarily burden retired residents on fixed incomes. Last year 93 of Idaho's 115 districts relied on supplemental levies, a reality which is unobtainable for our federally impacted schools. Thanks to rigorous, relentless pursuit of grant funding we survived this shortfall, yet these grants ended this year just as sequestration returns. Further cuts will lead to significant reductions in staffing and resources for students. Children in a district with an 89% Free and Reduced Lunch Rate deserve an equitable and fully funded education.

Thank you for your dedication to all the federally impacted students in Idaho. We are counting on your continued support. Hopefully you have had time to review the videos we've shared with your office to see the faces in our district that are directly impacted by your support. As your staff prepares for decisions regarding education and Impact Aid, we gladly offer ourselves as a trusted resource. Please never hesitate to contact me if I may provide additional information.

The Basics of Impact Aid

The Original K-12 Federal Education Program
Title VII Every Student Succeeds Act

INTRODUCTION

The Impact Aid Program, signed into law by President Harry Truman in 1950, is the nation's oldest K-12 Federal education program. Nationwide, approximately 1,200 school districts enrolling more than 10 million students benefit from Impact Aid funding.

Today's Impact Aid program had its beginnings in the early 1800s. Regulations were passed in 1821 to support the cost for schools to educate military-dependent children. The Johnson-O'Malley Act of 1934 identified that there were no local taxes to educate Native American children and provide funding for these children. This Act was the first acknowledgement by the Federal Government of its obligation to the local school district for educating children residing on Indian Lands. Additional pieces of legislation were passed in the late 1930s and early 1940s that were the precursor to the modern day Impact Aid program.

Impact Aid, originally PL. 81-874, was incorporated in 1994 into the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. It's now Title VII of the Every Student Succeeds Act. Funding for the program is approved annually by Congress through the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education Appropriations Subcommittee bill and the program is administered by the U.S. Department of Education. The program reimburses school districts for the loss of local tax revenue due to the presence of the Federal Government. Federal activities reduce local taxes because Federal property is removed from the tax roll and/or the school district is educating students with no or reduced tax revenue associated with those students. Lost tax revenue includes residential taxes, property taxes from business or industry, sales taxes, income taxes and local licenses and fees.

EXAMPLES OF FEDERAL IMPACTION

- Military installations
- Indian Trust, Treaty, and Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) Lands
- Federal low-rent housing facilities
- Federal properties such as national parks and Army Corps of Engineers projects and Federal facilities such as national laboratories, and VA hospitals

Impact Aid funding is direct, locally controlled and flexible. All Impact Aid funds appropriated annually by Congress are disbursed directly to school districts – bypassing state involvement and can be used for any general fund purpose such as instructional materials, salaries, transportation, technology or capital needs. All decisions on how Impact Aid funds are spent are made locally by elected school boards. This flexibility and local control allows school district leaders to target funds supporting all students wherever the needs are greatest.

Each school district must submit an Impact Aid application annually to the U.S. Department of Education. The application deadline is usually January 31. The Department reviews the applications and processes payments based on Congressional appropriations each fiscal year (October 1 - September 30). The Department allocates funding in multiple installments until all available funds are distributed. School district applications are audited, on average, once every five years.

The Impact Aid Program is the only K-12 Federal education program that is not forward funded. For example, FY 2018 funds for programs like Title I and IDEA are for the 2018-2019 school year, but for Impact Aid they are for the 2017-2018 school year. This means a delay in appropriations - caused by a Continuing Resolution (CR) or a government shutdown - has an immediate impact on Impact Aid-recipient school districts. Without a payment early in the school year, some districts may have difficulty funding day-to-day operations, instructional expenditures, utility payments, or payroll. Occasionally, due to cash flow deficits, school districts must defer payroll, dip into their fund balances, or borrow money while they await their Impact Aid payment.

The \$67.5 million sequester of Impact Aid in FY 2013 had a devastating impact on federally impacted schools. As one of the first programs to be cut, district leaders were forced to make tough choices including reductions in staff, increased class sizes, cuts to afterschool and arts programs, reduced professional development, fewer bus routes, and delays in technology upgrades and facilities maintenance. While a near-full restoration of Impact Aid in FY 2014 and a \$17 million increase in FY 2016 were welcome relief, funding caps on discretionary spending continue to be a concern for federally impacted schools.

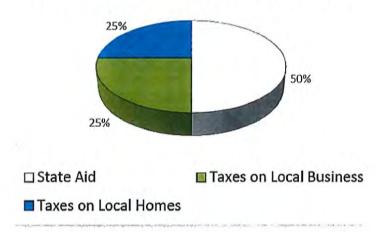
Financing Non-Federally Impacted School Districts

U.S. public schools are financed through a combination of state and local revenue. Usually 50-percent of a school district's funding is derived from state aid and 50-percent is derived from local funding. Local funding sources are comprised of a combination of business and residential property taxes and fees, and local sales tax.

Financing Federally Impacted School Districts

Federally impacted school districts receive state funding, the same as non-federally impacted schools. It is the local funding share that is reduced or eliminated because of a Federal presence that is not taxable. School districts with Federal lands, military installations, Federal low-rent housing or Indian Trust Land within their boundaries lose local revenue because of these non-taxable Federal activities. Impact Aid funding partially reimburses school districts for this loss of locally-derived revenue.

IMPACT AID

SECTION-BY-SECTION

SECTION 7002 FEDERAL PROPERTY

Section 7002 reimburses school districts that have lost significant local revenue due to Federal ownership of land within school district boundaries. School districts are dependent on

local property taxes as their major revenue source to fund educational programs for the children they serve. Because federally owned property does not generate taxes, the revenue for the school district is dramatically reduced. These school districts are required to educate the same number of students as before the Federal property was acquired. Impact Aid Federal Property payments offset some of the tax loss school districts experience on an annual basis.

Approximately 240 school districts are eligible under Section 7002 each year.

Examples of Eligible Federal Property

- National parks and grasslands
- National laboratories
- Army Corps of Engineers projects
- Military testing grounds
- Military academies
- Environmental waste sites

Eligibility

There are two eligibility criteria for a school district to be eligible for Section 7002:

- 1. The property was acquired by the Federal Government after 1938 AND
- 2. The assessed value of the property, when it was acquired by the Federal Government, is at least 10-percent of the school district's total assessed value. For example, if in 1939 the Federal Government acquires seven percent of the assessed value of Federal property in the district and then acquires an additional four percent in 1943, the school district would become eligible for an Impact Aid payment in 1943.

In addition, the property cannot have been acquired by exchange for other Federal property. To be eligible, the school district is not being substantially compensated by increases in revenues from Federal activities from the property.

School districts must submit an application for payment to the U.S. Department of Education each year. The formula for valuing eligible Federal property was changed beginning in Fiscal Year 2013. As a result, each school district receives a Foundation Payment based on a percentage of funds they received under the previous system. Remaing funding is distributed based on the value of taxable property within school district boundaries, as well as the local tax rate.

There are three steps to determine a school district's Maximum Payment

Step 1:

Total assessed value of taxable property

Number of acres less the 7002 acres

Average dollar-per-acre of taxable property

Step 2:

Average dollar-per-acre of taxable property **X** Number of eligible Federal acres = Value of Federal property

Step 3:

Value of Federal property **X** Local tax rate = Maximum payment

Section 7002 is underfunded; the level of appropriations meets only 11-percent of the program's need based on what it would require to fund each school district's Maximum Payment. As a result, the available funding after the Foundation Payment is made is equally prorated based on each school district's Maximum Payment as a percentage of the total program cost.

A Common Misconception . . .

Because they are completely funded by the Federal government, the Department of Defense and Bureau of Indian Education Schools are not considered public schools.

SECTION 7003 BASIC SUPPORT PAYMENTS FOR FEDERALLY CONNECTED CHILDREN

Basic Support Payments for federally connected children compensate school districts for educating students whose parents or legal guardians reside and/or work on Federal property, including children of members of the uniformed services, and children who reside on Indian Lands. Section 7003 is the largest component of the Impact Aid Program, both in regard to funding and to number of school districts.

A school district can choose one or both of the following two options to count its students:

- Parent-Pupil Survey: A U.S. Department of Education-approved form for counting the school district's federally connected children. The school district provides a form to parents for each enrolled child. The parent-pupil survey form is a means of authenticating the child's place of residence and the parent's place of employment.
- 2. Source Check: A U.S. Department of Education-approved means of counting the membership of a school district's federally connected children. It is provided to: 1) a parent's employer, who identifies the place of employment of a parent of a pupil claimed; 2) to a housing official, who indicates the residence of each pupil claimed; and 3) to a tribal official, who states each pupil claimed resides on Indian Lands over which that tribal official has jurisdiction.

Did you know . . .

Some school districts meet the eligibility requirements for both Sections 7002 and 7003. In the cases where school districts are receiving a payment under both Sections, the combined payment cannot be greater than the higher of the two maximum payments.

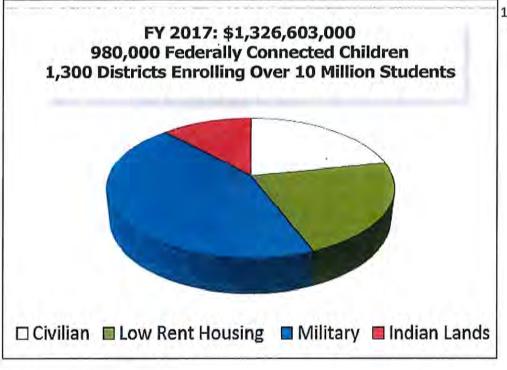
Eligibility

To be eligible for a Basic Support payment, a school district must educate at least 400 Federal students in average daily attendance (ADA) or they must represent at least three-percent of the school district's ADA.

Federally Connected Children

Those children whose parent(s) or legal guardian(s) reside and/

guardian(s) reside and/ or work on Federal property are considered federally connected. The law recognizes as eligible:



- Indian Land Children whose parent(s) live on Indian trust, treaty or ANSCA land (1.25 weight).
- Military on-base Children whose parent(s) are members of the uniformed services and reside on a military installation, including children of foreign military officers (1.0 weight).
- Military off-base Children whose parent(s) are members of the uniformed services but who reside off the military installation, including children of foreign military officers (.20 weight).
- Low rent housing Children whose parents reside in Federal low rent housing (not Section 8 housing) (.10 weight).
- Civilian Children whose parent(s) both live <u>AND</u> work on Federal property (1.0 calculation)
- Civilian whose parent works OR lives on Federal property* Children whose parent(s) resides on Federal property, but works on taxable land OR children whose parent(s) resides on taxable land, but works on Federal property (.05 weight).

^{*}Civilian students can only be calculated into a school district's payment if there are 1,000 in ADA or they represent at least 10-percent of the school district's ADA.

IMPACT AID GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ADA

Average daily attendance. Average number of students present (as opposed to enrolled) during the time a school is in session.

FISCAL YEAR (FY)

A period used for calculating Impact Aid payments. The Federal fiscal year begins on October 1 of any given year and ends on September 30. Federal fiscal years do not follow school calendar years.

LEARNING OPPORTUNITY THRESHOLD (LOT)

The percent that indicates how dependent a school district is on Impact Aid funds—the higher the LOT percentage, the closer the LOT payment is to the Maximum Basic Support Payment.

LOCAL CONTRIBUTION RATE (LCR)

The estimated local share of the cost of elementary and secondary education.

LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCY (LEA)

A board of education or other legally constituted local school authority having administrative control and direction of free public education in a county, township, independent school district, or other school district, including any state agency that operates and maintains facilities for providing a free public education.

PL-81-874

Original Impact Aid statute; passed in 1950. In 1965, it was used by Congress as the legislative vehicle to pass the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). In 1994, Impact Aid was folded into ESEA as Title VIII and PL-81-874 was repealed. In 2015, Impact Aid was reauthorized as Title VII in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

SECTION 7002 (FEDERAL PROPERTY)

Provides assistance to a local school district that has lost a portion of its tax base due to Federal acquisition. Eligibility is determined by how and when the land was acquired by the Federal government.

SECTION 7003 (BASIC SUPPORT)

Payments made to school districts that educate at least 400 Federal students who are in average daily attendance (ADA), or have at least a three-percent ADA of Federal students.

STUDENT WEIGHTS

Federal students are given different weights to calculate a school district's payment. They are as follows: Indian Lands children 1.25; Military on-base 1.00; Civilian children whose parents live AND work on base 1.00; Military off-base children .20; Low-rent housing children .10; Civilian children whose parents live OR work on Federal property .05.

TOTAL CURRENT EXPENDITURES

All expenditures for free public education, including expenditures for administration, instruction, attendance and health services, transportation, operation and maintenance, fixed charges, and net expenditures to cover deficits for food services and student body activities. Does not include expenditures for community services, capital outlay, debt service, or any expenditures made from funds awarded under part A of Title I and Title VI.

WEIGHTED FEDERAL STUDENT UNITS (WFSUs)

Children in average daily attendance multiplied by the categorical student weights in the Impact Aid law. These units are multiplied by the Local Contribution Rate (LCR) to determine an LEA's Maximum Basic Support Payment.

The District is dedicated to consulting with local Tribal officials and parents of Indian children in the planning and development of Indian Policies and Procedures, general education programs, and activities. These policies will be reviewed annually and revisions will be made within 90 days of the determination that requirements are not adequately being met.

Policy 1: The Lapwai School District will disseminate relevant applications, evaluations, program plans and information related to the District's education program and activities with sufficient advance notice to allow Tribes and parents of Indian children the opportunity to review and make recommendations.

How?

- a) Distributed to all Nez Perce Tribe employees by email
- b) Available on the District website at www.lapwai.org
- c) Linked at the Lapwai School District Facebook Page: Lapwai School District #341
- d) Sent home with all students Preschool through 12th Grade
- e) Copies available at the District Office at 404 S. Main St.
- f) Copies distributed during fall parent-teacher conferences
- g) Available at the Annual Impact Aid Meeting

How Far in Advance?

The Lapwai School District will disseminate relevant applications, evaluations, program plans and information related to the District's education program no later than November 30th annually.

Policy 2: The Lapwai School District will provide an opportunity for Tribes and parents of Indian children to provide their views on the District's educational program and activities, including recommendations on the needs of their children and Indian Policies and Procedures (IPPs): A Reference Guide for Evaluating IPPs on how the District's may help those children realize the benefits of the District's education programs and activities.

As part of this requirement, the Lapwai School District will:

- (i) Notify Tribes and the parents of Indian children of the opportunity to submit comments and recommendations, considering the tribe's preference for method of communication, and
- (ii) Modify the method of and time for soliciting Indian views, if necessary, to ensure the maximum participation of Tribes and parents of Indian children.

Procedure 2(a): The parents of Indian children and members of the Tribe can provide input on the educational program and activities through the Annual Impact Aid Questionnaire distributed as described in Policy 1; a-g.

Procedure 2(b): It is recommended the parents of Indian Children complete and return the Annual Impact Aid Questionnaire prior to January 31st annually, yet questionnaires are welcome throughout the year and remain available on the District website. Input is always welcome by contacting the Superintendent as well.

Procedure 2(c): The superintendent or their designee will contact the Tribe annually to solicit their preference of communication.

Procedure 2(d): The Superintendent will revise their approach to communication when requested by the Tribe.

Procedure 2(e): The Superintendent will utilize multiple methods of communication to reach the maximum number of parents as described in Policy 1; a-g. The Superintendent will also confer with the Nez Perce Tribe Education Department to select times for meetings that do not conflict with Tribal holidays and events.

Policy 3: The Lapwai School District will, at least annually, assess the extent to which Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children in the District's education program and activities. As part of this requirement, the District will:

- (i) Share relevant information related to Indian children's participation in the District's education program and activities with Tribes and parents of Indian children; and
- (ii) Allow Tribes and parents of Indian children the opportunity and time to review and comment on whether Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children.

Procedure 3: The Lapwai School District will annually examine and evaluate the Indian participation in all educational programs and activities.

What programs will be evaluated?

- Extended Learning/After School Programs
- Extracurricular Activities and Clubs
- Athletics
- Gifted and Talented Programs
- Advance Placement/College and Career Readiness Activities
- All Other Programs and Activities

How will the analysis occur?

The Superintendent will request enrollment records for all educational programs and activities. Should a discrepancy in participation be identified, the Superintendent will immediately notify the Board of Trustees for input on corrective action.

What data will be used?

Enrollment records from the District student information system for all schools as well as registration records and rosters for all programs.

When will the analysis occur?

The analysis will occur prior to January 31st annually. A second analysis may be requested by the Board of Trustees should a concern be reported.

Procedure 3(a): The Lapwai School District will communicate the results of the evaluation with the Tribes and parents of Indian children no later than February 1st annually utilizing the same communication methods as described in Policy 1; a-g.

Procedure 3(b): The Lapwai School District will ensure Tribes and parents of Indian children will be afforded the opportunity and time to review and comment on whether Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children.

How?

- a) Annual Impact Aid Questionnaire
- b) Annual Impact Aid Meeting
- c) Fall and Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences
- d) Monthly School Board Meetings
- e) Contacting the Superintendent
- f) Indian Parent Committee Meetings
- g) All Other Committee Meetings and School Events

When is the Annual Impact Aid Meeting?

The annual Impact Aid Meeting is scheduled no later than November 30th.

How far in advance of the meeting will the evaluation be shared?

Participation evaluation information will be shared a minimum of two weeks prior to the Annual Impact Aid Meeting and sooner whenever possible.

Policy 4: The Lapwai School District will modify the IPPs if necessary, based upon the results of any assessment or input as described in this document.

How and when can Tribes or parents of Indian children can make recommendations for changes to the IPPs?

Recommendations are welcome throughout the year by contacting the Superintendent as well as encouraged at the following:

- a) Annual Impact Aid Questionnaire
- b) Annual Impact Aid Meeting
- c) Fall and Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences
- d) Monthly School Board Meetings
- e) Indian Parent Committee Meetings
- f) All Other Committee Meetings and School Events

Who evaluates the recommendations?

The recommendations are evaluated by the Lapwai School District Board of Trustees with input welcome from the Nez Perce Tribe Education Department and Lapwai School District Indian Parent Committee.

Who decides if the IPPs will be revised to accommodate these recommendations?

The Lapwai School District Board of Trustees determines if the IPPs will require revision based on the recommendations.

How will the Tribes and parents of Indian children be made aware of the changes?

The Tribes and parents of Indian children be made aware of the changes as described in Policy 1; a-g.

Policy 5: The Lapwai School District will respond at least annually in writing to comments and recommendations made by Tribes or parents of Indian children, and disseminate the responses to the Tribe and parents of Indian children prior to the submission of the IPPs by the District.

How will the District respond to the comments received through the IPP consultation process?

The District will respond in writing annually, grouped by topic, to the Tribe and parents of Indian children.

When will the District respond to comments and recommendations?

The District will respond to comments and recommendations no later than February 1st annually.

How will the responses be disseminated?

The responses will be shared widely as described in Policy 1; a-g. The written responses by group will also be published in the Tac Titooqan Newspaper.

Policy 6: The Lapwai School District will provide a copy of the IPPs annually to the affected Tribe.

How and when will the IPPs will be sent to the Tribe?

The District will send the IPPs to the Tribe no later than January 31st annually according to their preferred method of communication as described in Policy 2.

What are Indian Policy and Procedures (IPPs)?

An IPP document describes how an LEA is going to accomplish effective consultation with Tribes and parents about the equal participation of Indian children in its educational program consistent with the following overarching principles:

- (1) Create an educational program (include extra curricular activities) that ensures Indianchildren participate in programs and activities on an equal basis with all other children;
- (2) Give parents of Indian children and Indian tribes the opportunity to present their views on the educational program, including an opportunity to make recommendations on the needs of Indian children and how the local educational agency (LEA) may help Indian children realize the full benefits of the educational programs and activities;
- (3) Include and consult the parents of Indian children and Indian tribes in planning and developing of the IPPs and educational programs and activities; and
- (4) Give parents of Indian children and Indian tribes served by the LEA access to the relevant applications, evaluations, and program plans.

In general, an LEA that claims children residing on Indian lands must consult with and involve local tribal officials and parents of Indian children in the planning and development of:

- (1) Its Indian policies and procedures (IPPs), and
- (2) The LEA's general educational program and activities.

What Must an IPP Contain?

There are six actions an LEA must take to comply with the IPP law and regulations. The LEA must state what it is going to do and then describe specifically how they are going to accomplish them.

<u>Policy 1-</u> An LEA must disseminate relevant applications, evaluations, program plans and information related to the LEA's education program and activities with *sufficient advance notice* to allow tribes and parents of Indian children the opportunity to review and make recommendations.

Procedure 1 - In this case, the LEA should specifically describe:

- How the applications, evaluations, program plans and information will be distributed to tribes and the parents of Indian children?
- How far in advance of any meeting on these topics, the materials will be provided to the parents of Indian children and the tribes.

<u>Policy 2-</u> Provide an opportunity for tribes and parents of Indian children to provide their views on the LEA's educational program and activities, including recommendations on the needs of their children and

on how the LEA may help those children realize the benefits of the LEA's education programs and activities. As part of this requirement, the LEA will -

- (i) Notify tribes and the parents of Indian children of the opportunity to submit comments and recommendations, considering the tribe's preference for method of communication, and
- (ii) Modify the method of and time for soliciting Indian views, if necessary, to ensure the maximum participation of tribes and parents of Indian children.

Procedure 2(a)- The LEA should describe **how** the parents of Indian children and members of the tribe can provide input on the educational program and activities.

Procedure 2(b)- The LEA should say **how and when** the LEA will notify tribe and parents of Indian lands of the opportunities to submit recommendations and comments.

Procedure 2(c)- How they will solicit the tribe's preference of communication.

Procedure 2(d)- How they will accommodate the preference in 2(c).

Procedure (e)- **How** the LEA will establish a method of communication and time of meetings to ensure maximum participation

<u>Policy 3-</u> The LEA will, at least annually, assess the extent to which Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children in the LEA's education program and activities. As part of this requirement, the LEA will:

- (i) Share relevant information related to Indian children's participation in the LEA's education program and activities with tribes and parents of Indian children; and
- (ii) Allow tribes and parents of Indian children the opportunity and time to review and comment on whether Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children.

Procedure 3- The LEA should explain *how* they will evaluate the Indian participation in educational programs and activities. You should be able to look at their supporting documents and be able to see how many Indian children were enrolled in AP science for example. How many were on the varsity soccer team, etc.). At a minimum, the LEA should describe the following:

- Which programs will be evaluated
- · How the analysis will occur
- · What data will be used
- When the analysis will occur

Procedure 3(a)- The LEA should describe **how and when** it will communicate the results of the evaluation with the tribes and parents of Indian children. Making the data available in the school administrative office is not necessarily enough to meet this requirement. Some LEAs

print summaries of the data in the school newsletters which are sent home to parents. Some send the data home and to the tribes. Some ask the tribes to post the information as well. Making it electronically accessible is better than available for review upon request; however, we encourage a more active sharing of the information with parents of Indian children and the tribes.

Procedure 3(b)- The LEA should describe *how and when* tribes and parents of Indian children will be afforded the opportunity and time to review and comment on whether Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children. At a minimum, the LEA should describe:

- How the LEA will accept comments, recommendations or feedback on equal participation from the tribes and parents of Indian children. Meetings? In writing? Email? In Person?
- If there is an open meeting for feedback, when is the meeting? Is it scheduled at a time
 and place that will encourage maximum participation from the tribes and parents of
 Indian children?
- How far in advance of the meeting will the evaluation be shared? Is there enough time
 for tribes and parents of Indian children to review the information and provide
 meaningful comments?

<u>Policy 4</u>- Modify the IPPs if necessary, based upon the results of any assessment or input described in §222.94(b).

Procedure 4- The LEA should explain the criteria for making a change to the IPPs based on assessment or input.

- How and when the tribes or parents of Indian children can make recommendations for changes to the IPPs?
- Who evaluates the recommendations?
- Who decides if the IPPs will be revised to accommodate these recommendations?
- When will the changes be implemented?
- . How will the tribes and parents of Indian children be made aware of the changes?

Policy 5- Respond at least annually in writing to comments and recommendations made by tribes or parents of Indian children, and disseminate the responses to the tribe and parents of Indian children prior to the submission of the IPPs by the LEA.

Procedure 5- The LEA should describe:

- How it will respond to the comments received through the IPP consultation process.
 Will they be addressed individually? Grouped by topic?
- When it will respond to comments and recommendations

Indian Policies and Procedures (IPPs) - A Reference Guide for Evaluating IPPs

 How will the responses be disseminated? Making them available is not the same as dissemination.

Policy 6- Provide a copy of the IPPs annually to the affected tribe or tribes.

Procedure 6- The LEA should describe *how and when* the IPPs will be sent to the tribes.

Policy Title: VOLUNTEERS Code: 406.4

Lapwai School District recognizes the valuable contributions made to the total school program by members of the community who act as volunteers. These volunteers have not entered into an express or implied compensation agreement with the District. Volunteers are excluded from the definition of "employee" under the appropriate state and federal statutes.

School Volunteers

- 1. Any and all volunteers must complete an application to include completion of a statement regarding their level of involvement with legal authorities;
- 2. Any and all volunteers must complete fingerprinting and criminal background investigations;
- 3. Any and all volunteers must be approved by the School Board prior to their service;
- 4. Any and all volunteers are "at will" and may be removed from their volunteer position by the District at any time with or without just cause;
- 5. Any and all volunteers must comply with any training and supervision by approved District employees.

Athletic Volunteers

- 1. Athletic volunteers must complete an application to include completion of a statement regarding their level of involvement with legal authorities;
- 2. Athletic volunteers must complete fingerprinting and criminal background investigations;
- 3. Athletic volunteers must be approved by the School Board prior to their service;
 - a. Athletic volunteers must be approved by the head coach, athletic director, principal, and superintendent prior to submitting to the school board for approval.
- 4. Athletic volunteers are "at will" and may be removed from their volunteer position by the District at any time with or without just cause;
- 5. Athletic volunteers must comply with any training and supervision by approved District employees as well as IHSAA rules, regulations, and codes of conduct for coaches;
- 6. Athletic volunteers must become CPR, concussion, sudden cardiac arrest, and AED certified prior serving students;
- 7. Athletic volunteers may not be the spouse or the children of the coach or other board approved volunteers;

8. The following ratios of adults to student athletes will guide the athletic volunteer recruitment process and may not be exceeded:

Baseball: 1 to 10

Basketball: 1 to 10

Cheerleading: 1 to 10

Football: 1 to 8

Softball: 1 to 10

Track: 1 to 10

Volleyball: 1 to 10
