Principal Pinkham attended with these scholars to celebrate their success.

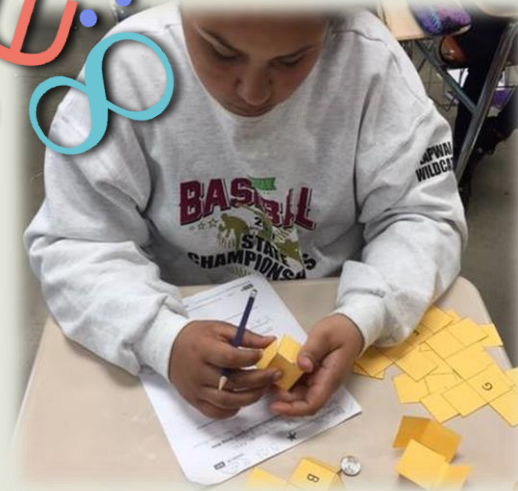
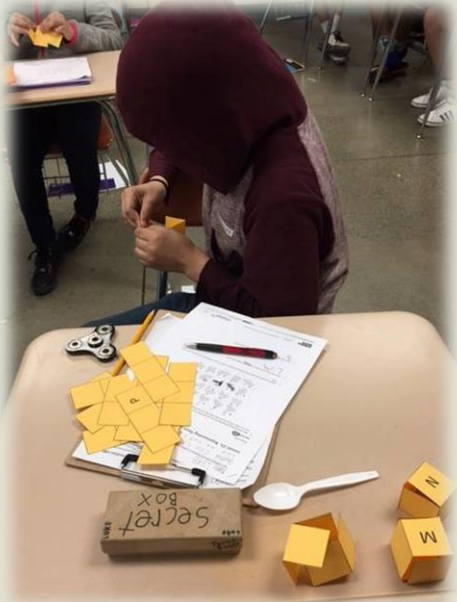
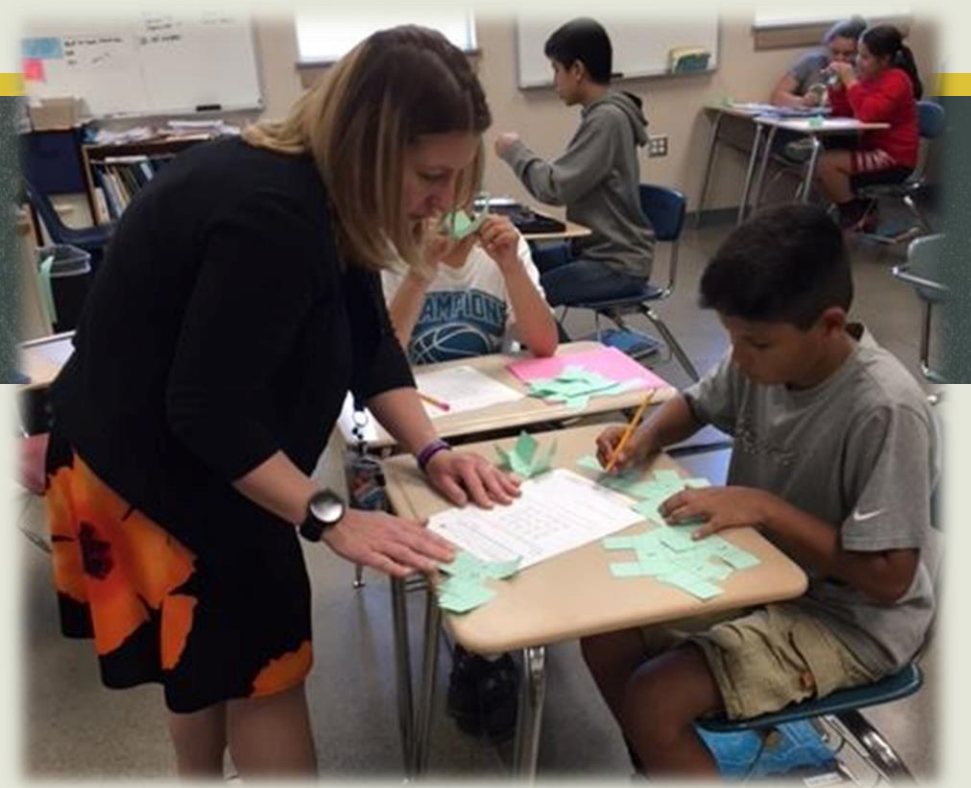




# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Mathematicians



In Mrs. Kinnick's 6th grade math class, students are representing three-dimensional figures using nets. They experimented with large cut-out patterns. Their lesson summary: If the surface of a 3-dimensional solid can be cut along sufficiently many edges so that the faces can be placed in one plane to form a connected figure, then the resulting system of faces is called a net of the solid.





# Hands On Health Learning

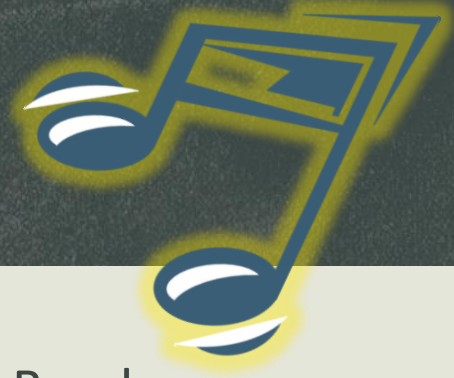


This week in Mrs. Melton and Ms. Barnett's health class, students began their week long training in CPR.

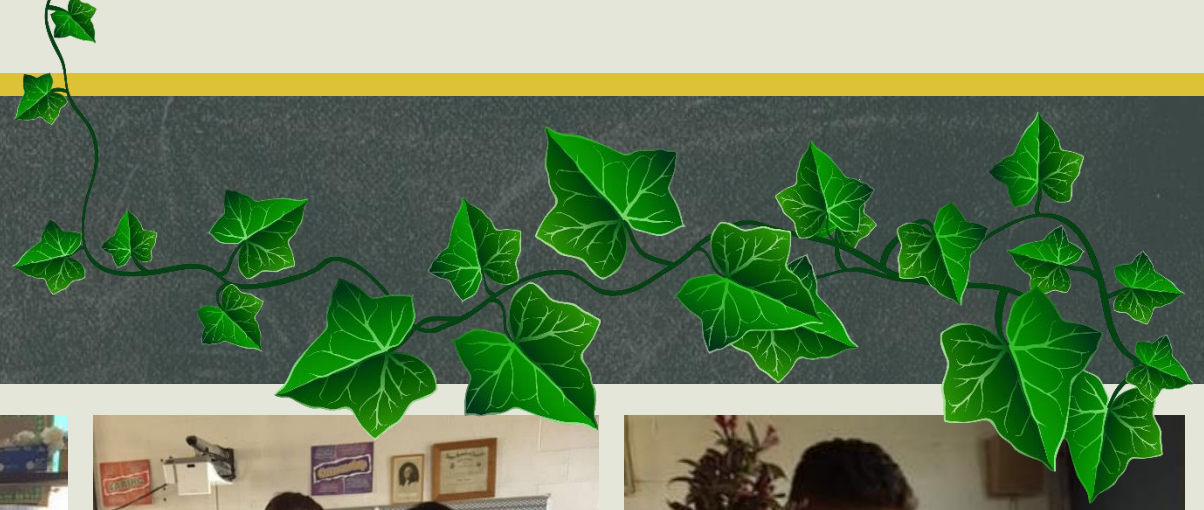

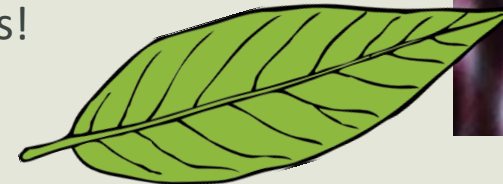




# Botany at Lapwai Middle-High School

Thank you to all the volunteers, sponsors and the community for coming out and making this event a success!







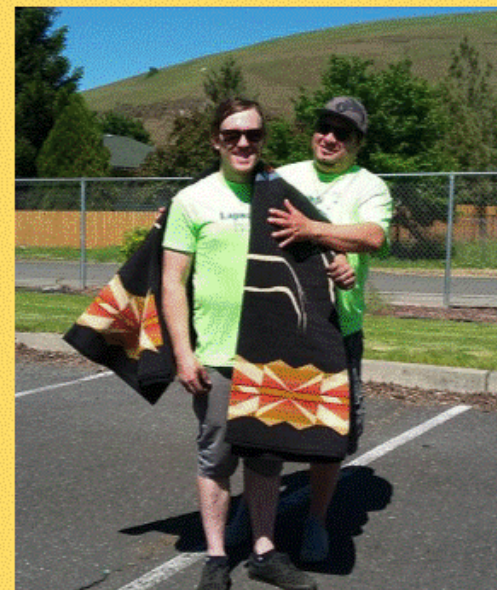
