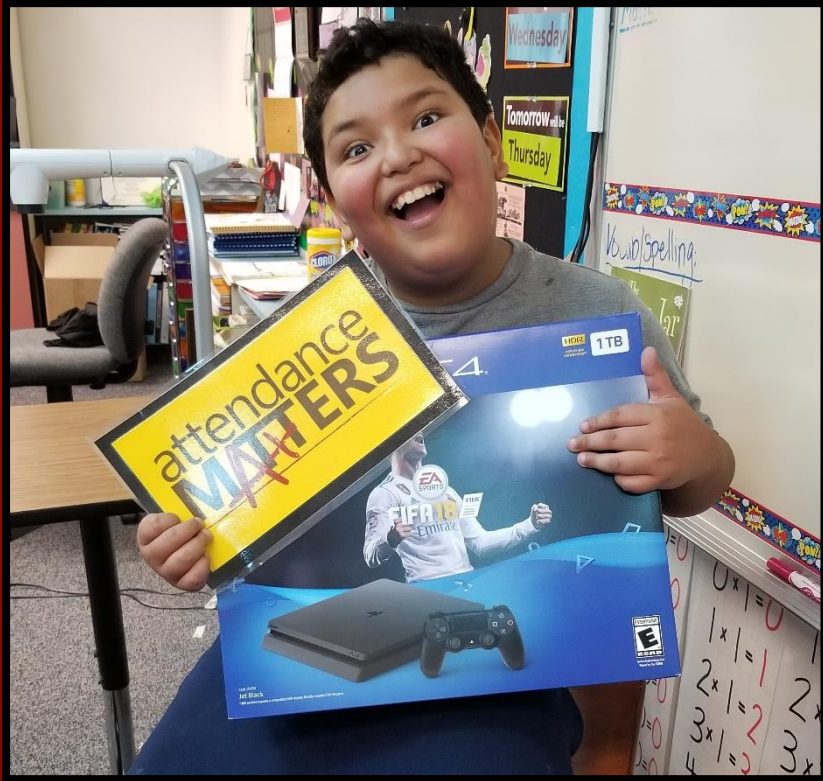

Youth category will win a Pizza party.

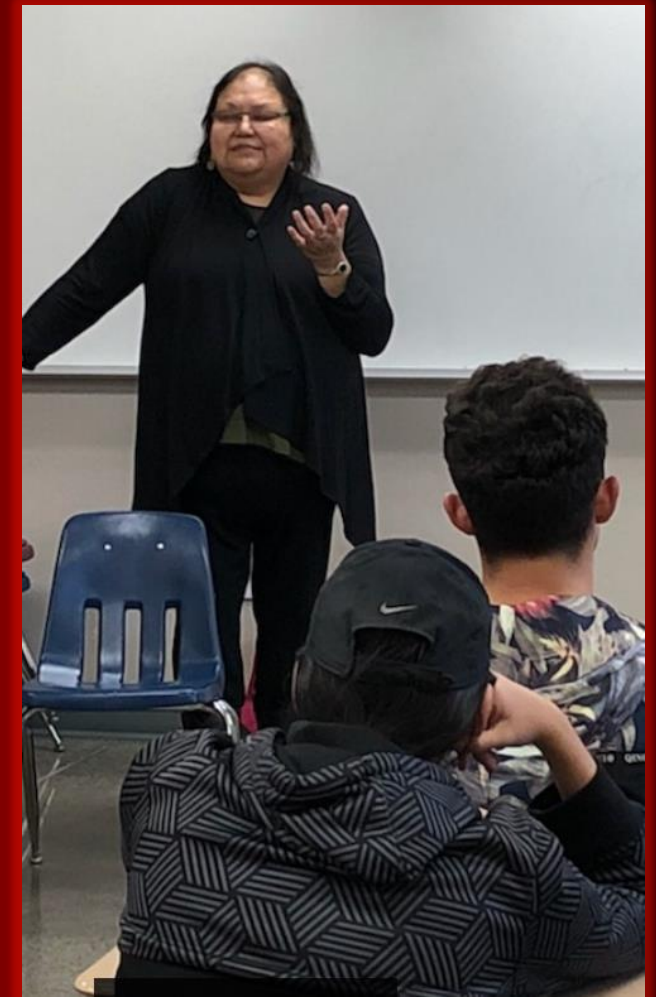

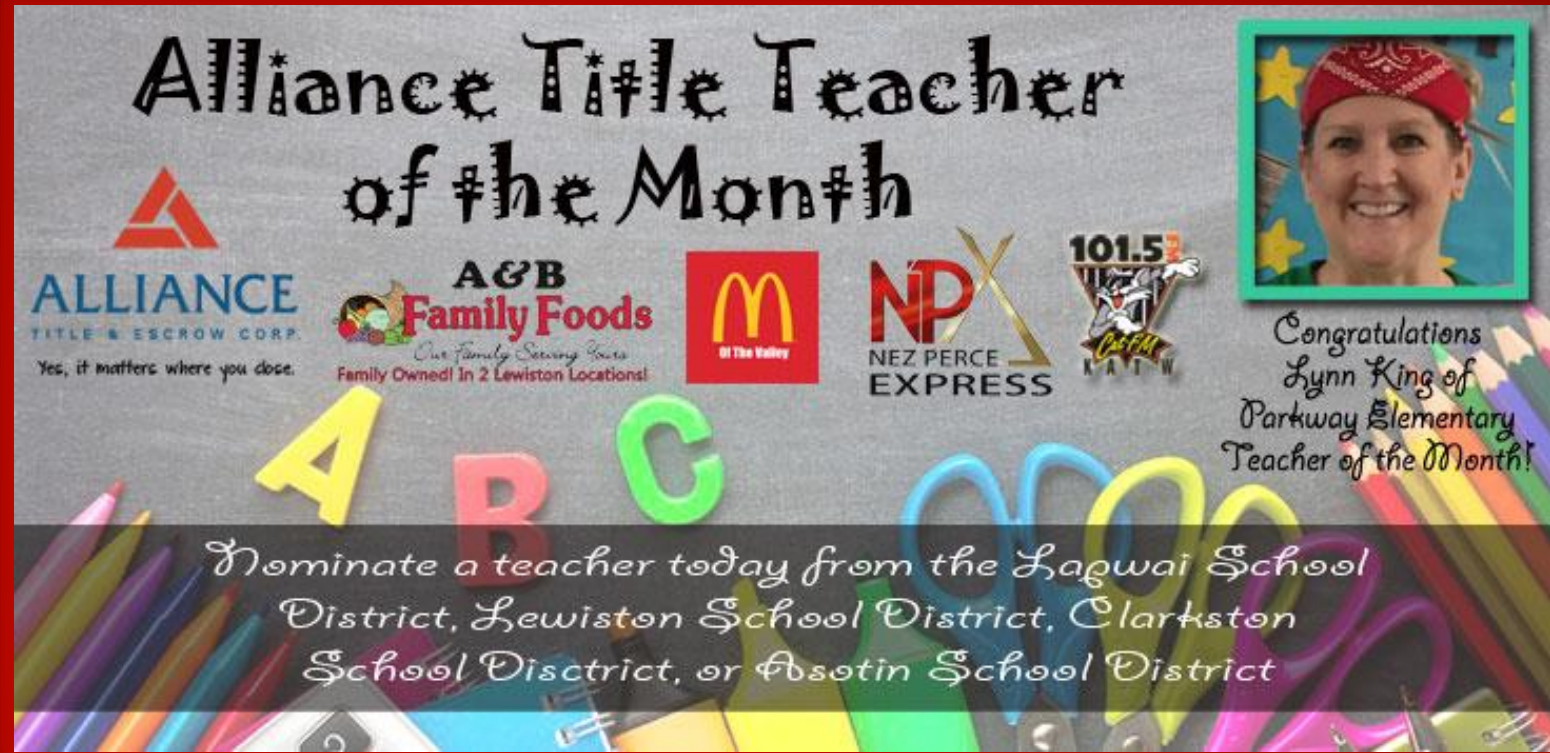
