




Did you know?

Important Notice Non-Resident Students

- Out-of-district open enrollment is a program that spans one school year at a time. Parents/guardians must reapply each spring for the following school year.
- o Open Enrollment Applications are available at the Lapwai School District Office. New and returning students who do not reside within the Lapwai School District are encouraged to apply prior to June 1st.
- o Students must obey all policies and regulations of the Lapwai Schools as a condition for continued enrollment.
- Exclusive of school-scheduled activities, non-resident students must maintain a minimum of 88% of the classroom-scheduled time per semester as a condition for continued enrollment.
