









LAPWAI BUTTERFLY PROJECT: Where are the butterflies?

Marcie Carter, Ethan Whitetemple, along with Devin Boyer, LMS-HS teacher, and Lapwai students are scratching the surface to find out what happened to the butterflies in the valley.

They are scoping our community hills, laying transect lines out to the native vegetation, and documenting points on the transects. They are using quadrates and putting frames on the ground to look at plants. They are seeking evidence of butterfly eggs and caterpillars. They GPS each point of their transect lines and use drones to collect images, such as mirror infrared photos, to see what the spectral imagery is like. Good luck, scientists!






- The “average onset first time use for prescription drugs” for Lapwai Youth is 13.3 years old.
