Nez Perce Education Standard: Community Orientation



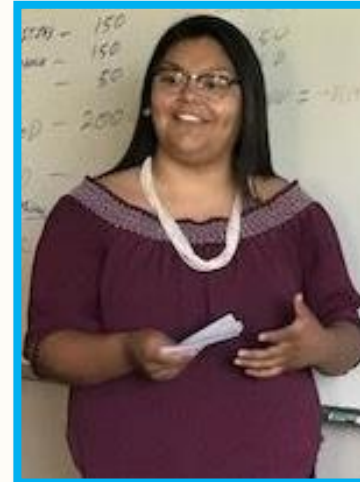

Senior Project Presentations



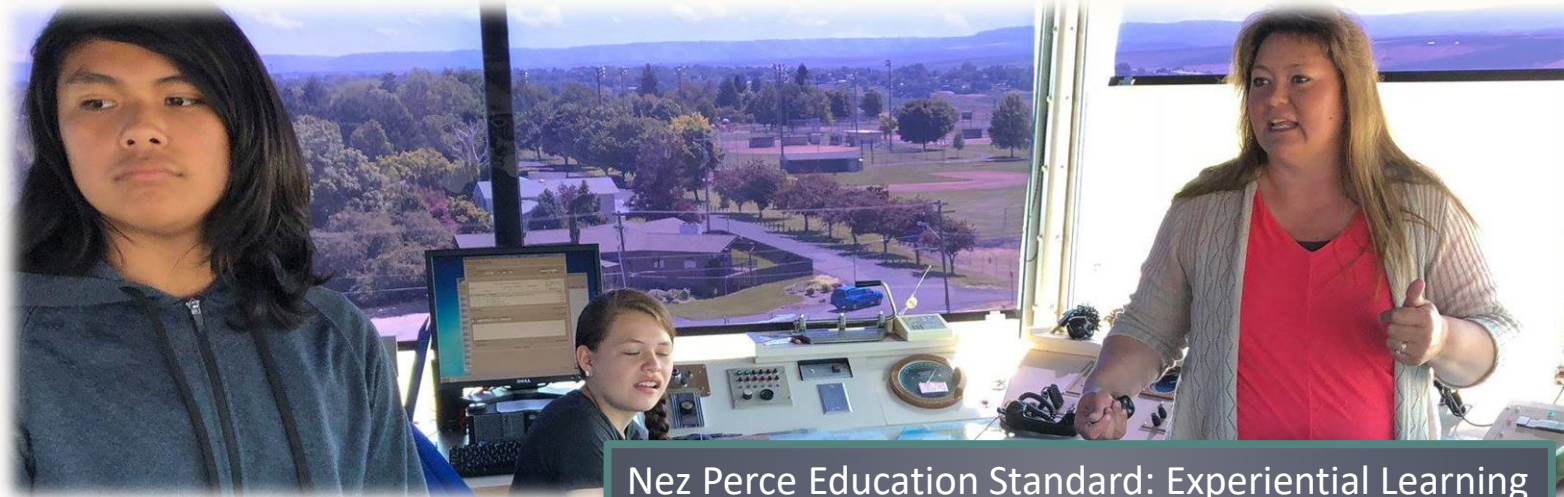
Lapwai seniors presented their senior projects last week. Thank you to all the Lapwai Wildcat staff and parents who supported these seniors with their research, writing, and presentations.

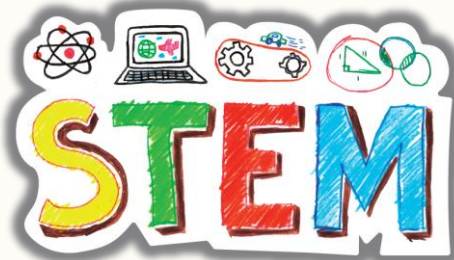




AISES Energy Challenge

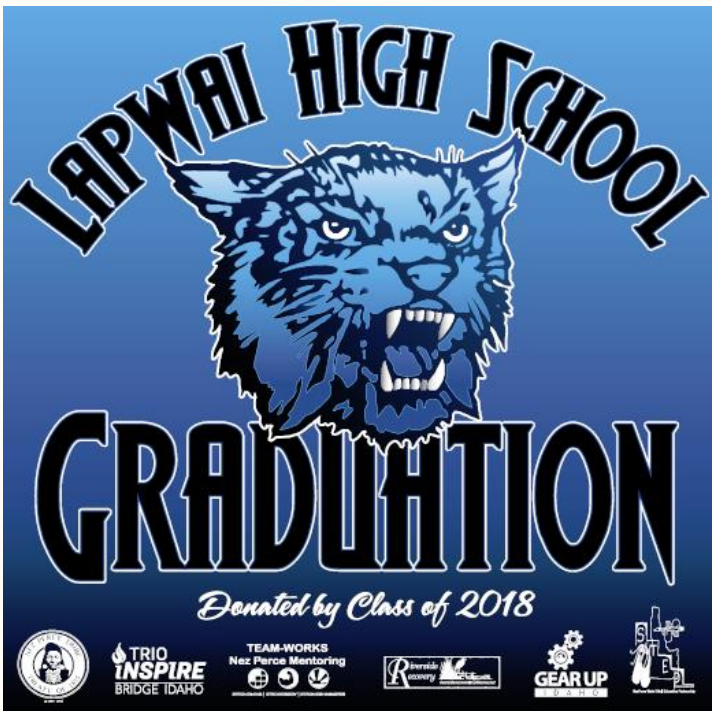
