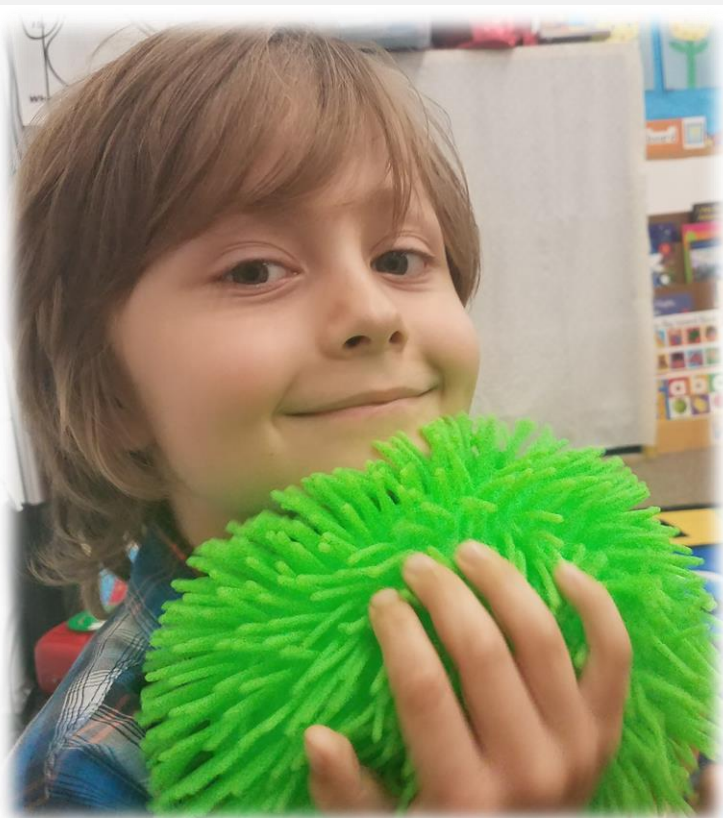

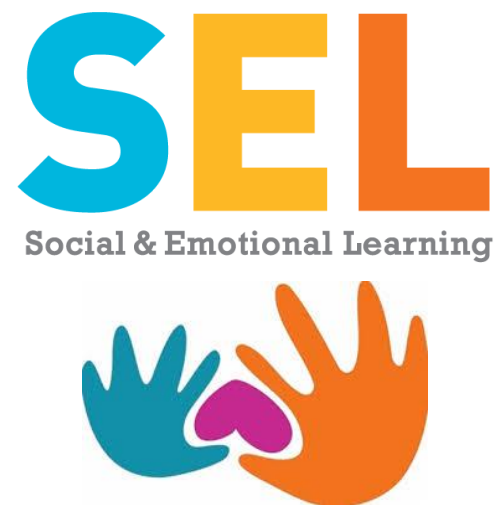

Kindergarteners have been working on giving compliments, passing around a complement ball. Kindergarten is Respectful, Responsible & Safe.

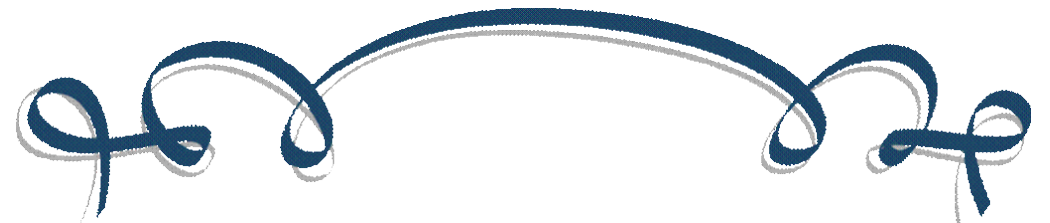




# Congratulations Anton Arthur!

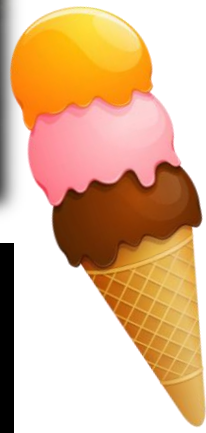

Mrs. Hewett's first grade scientists explored states of matter, making ice cream in a bag this week.

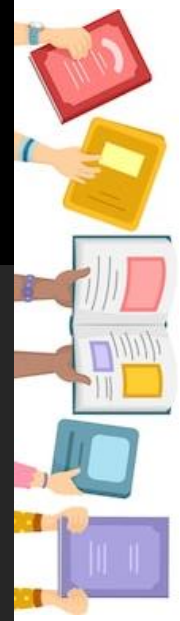

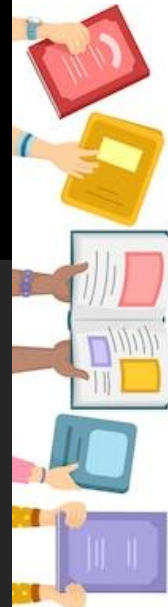

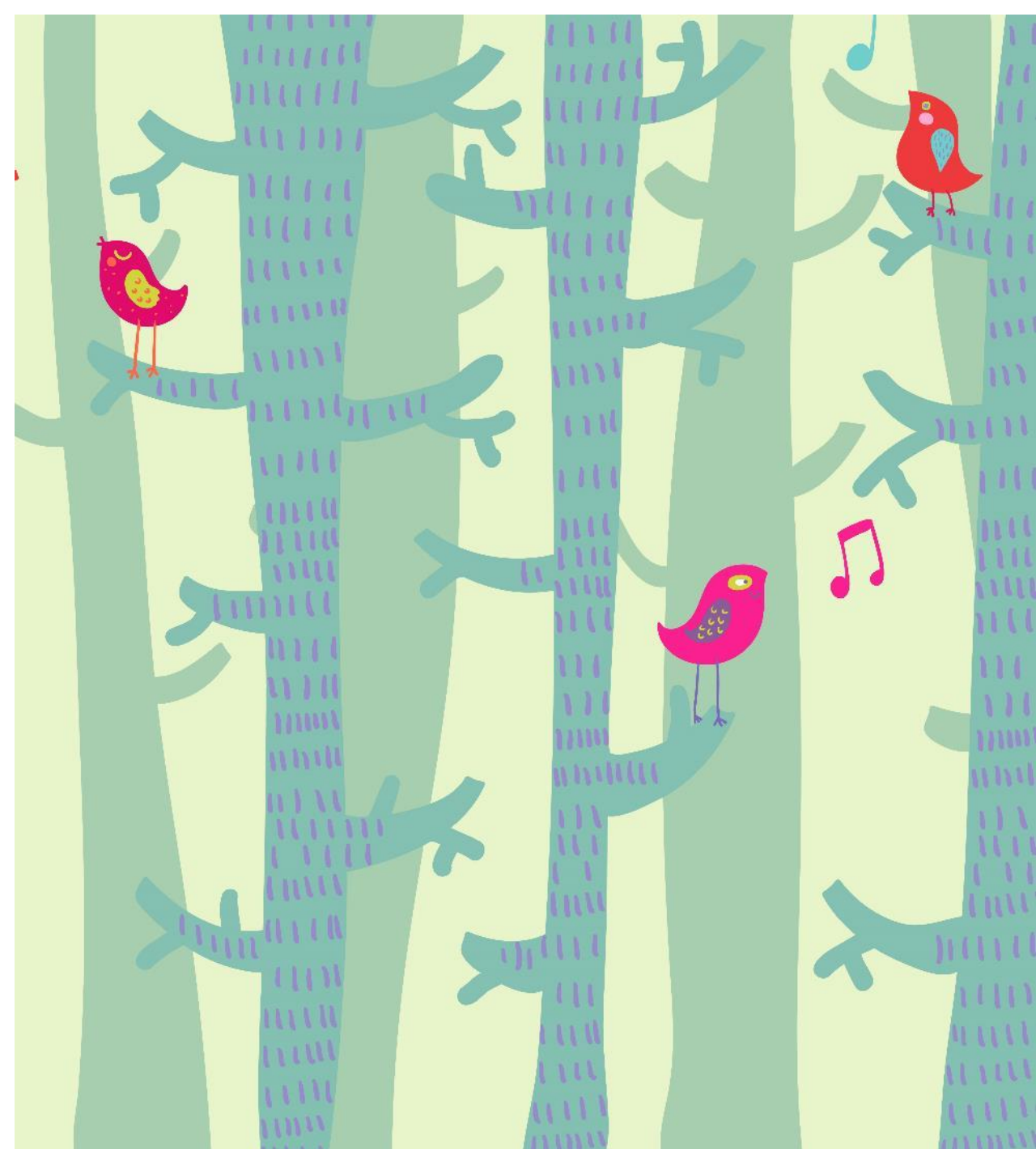

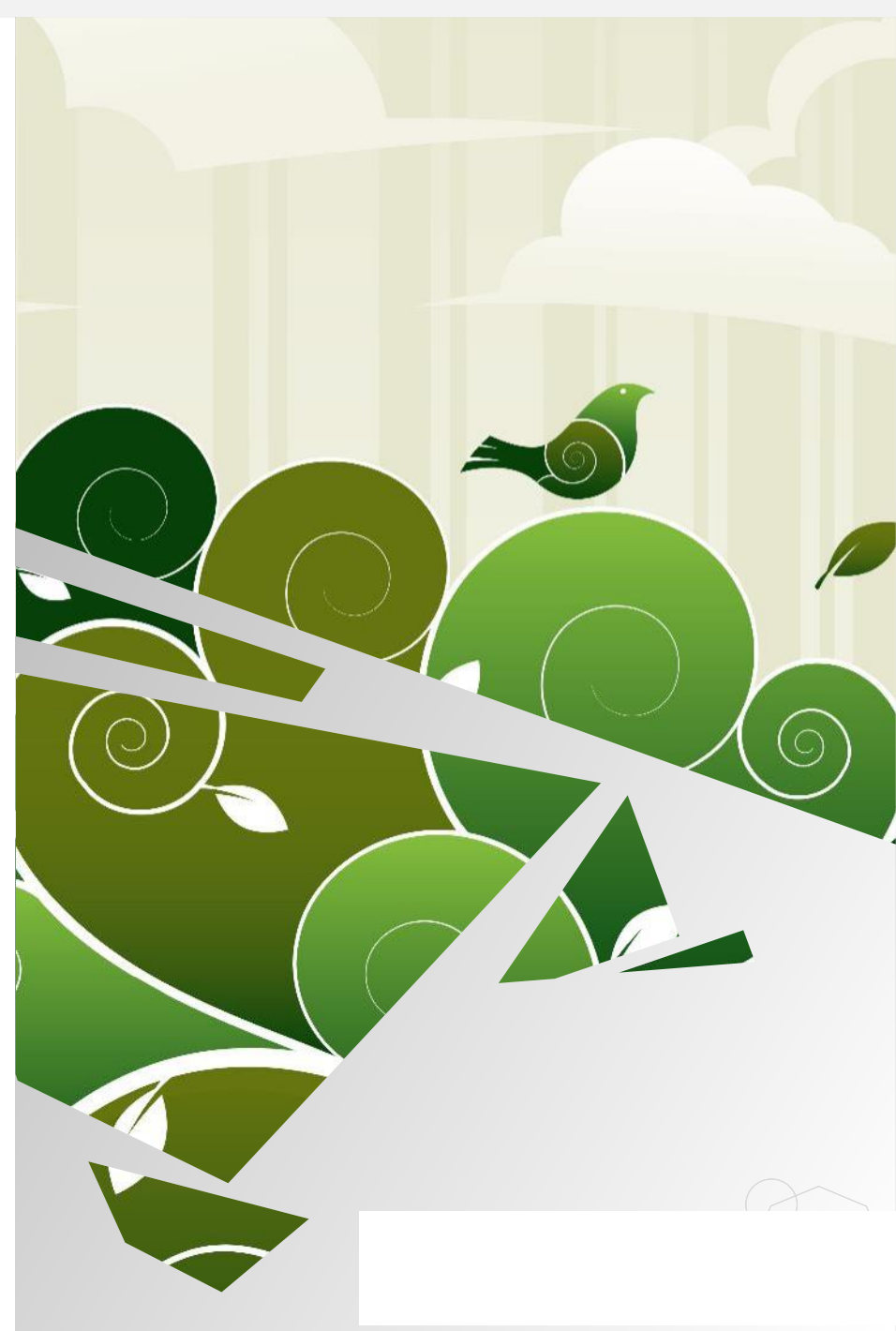

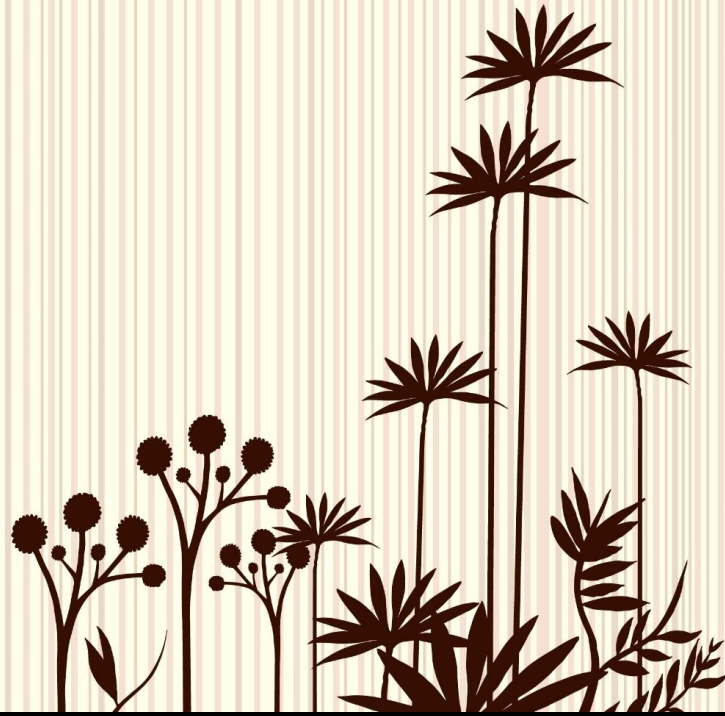


## Non-Resident Students Time to Reapply

- Out-of-district open enrollment is a program that spans one school year at a time. Parents/guardians must reapply each spring for the following school year.
- Open Enrollment Applications are available at the Lapwai School District Office. **New and returning** students who do not reside within the Lapwai School District were encouraged to apply prior to **June 1<sup>st</sup>**.
- Students must obey all policies and regulations of the Lapwai Schools as a condition for continued enrollment.
- Exclusive of school-scheduled activities, non-resident students must maintain a minimum of 88% of the classroom-scheduled time per semester as a condition for continued enrollment.
