






Non-Resident Students Time to Reapply

- Out-of-district open enrollment is a program that spans one school year at a time. Parents/guardians must reapply each spring for the following school year.
- Open Enrollment Applications are available at the Lapwai School District Office. New and returning students who do not reside within the Lapwai School District were encouraged to apply prior to June 1st.
- Students must obey all policies and regulations of the Lapwai Schools as a condition for continued enrollment.
- Exclusive of school-scheduled activities, non-resident students must maintain a minimum of 88% of the classroom-scheduled time per semester as a condition for continued enrollment.

Participation incentives for Kamiah and Lapwai staff:

- Lodging and meals: Covered at WSU (basic accommodations- double occupancy residence hall and meal ticket to cafeteria)
- ➢ Stipend: \$50/day
- College Credits: \$50 for one credit or \$100 for 2 credits at LCSC
- Transportation: Available by van from Kamiah and Lapwai. Alternate- \$50 fuel assistance per vehicle for car pools of 3 or more staff
