## Nez Perce Tribe Local Education Fund Awards




### Dedicated Teachers at Lapwai Middle-High School

## Attention Wildcat Alumni

The Nez Perce National Historical Park is currently working on redesigning and renovating its museum exhibit space. It is estimated that the new museum will be completed by early 2020. ### Important Revisions to Attendance Policies and Procedures

**GradesPreK-8:** Students who miss 40% or more of the scheduled instructional *minutes* of the school year will be automatically retained and required to repeat their current grade. The parent or guardian may appeal this retention with the Lapwai School District Attendance Committee.

**Grades 9-12:** Absences will be recorded by period. When a student misses twelve (12) days in any given period in a semester, the student will be withdrawn and lose credit for each class with 12 or more absences. The parent or guardian may appeal the loss of credit with the Lapwai School District Attendance Committee.

Attendance Committee Appeals: Approved appeals by the Lapwai School District Attendance Committee will include a plan to ensure regular and punctual attendance including resources and mentors to support improvement. Failure to adhere to the Attendance Committee plan will result in retention in grades PreK-8 and proceeding with loss of credit in grades 9-12.



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### Community Resource Specialist & Truancy Interventionist

A new position has been created to support students and their families in removing barriers to regular and punctual attendance. Shawna Leighton will be the district Community Resource Specialist and Truancy Interventionist. Shawna can connect families with tribal, county, and state resources. She will act as a mentor for students who struggle with school attendance and support their academic success. This role has been graciously supported by Local Education Funds from the Nez Perce Tribe.

### **Proof of Residency**

Incoming kindergarteners and transfer students from another school district will require proof of residency during the registration process. Students residing with a parent or legal guardian within district boundaries will automatically be accepted. Students residing outside of district boundaries or living in a household without their parent or legal guardian will be required to complete an Open Enrollment Application for consideration.

Incoming kindergarten students with Lapwai Head Start records reflecting an in-district physical address from will not be required to submit proof of residency unless requested.

Proof of residency must be  $\underline{1}$  of the following showing parent/guardian name with current physical address and proof must be dated no more than 30 days prior:

- Rental/Lease/Home Agreement
- Utility Bill
- Cable Bill
- Homeowners/Renters Insurance

If you are unable to provide one proof of residency from the first list, you must then provide  $\underline{3}$  proofs of residency from the following list below and be dated no more than 30 days prior:

- Driver's License or State ID
- Auto Insurance
- Paycheck Stub
- Bank Statement
- Credit Card Statement
- Letter or Document from a Tribal/Federal/State Agency

### **Out-of-District Students**

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Acceptance of out-of-district students is a program that spans one school year at a time. Parents/guardians must reapply each spring for the following school year. Please complete an Open Enrollment application at the Lapwai School District Office prior to registration August 15th and 16th. We are located in back of the gymnasium lobby at 404 S. Main Street in Lapwai. Idaho Code also requires districts to charge tuition for out of state students, please contact the district office for additional information. Actual student enrollment may be considered before approving an out-of-district enrollment request.

### **Staff Qualifications**

Federal law requires that each school district receiving Title I funds notify parents of each student attending any school receiving these funds that information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher(s) may be requested.

As a parent of a student attending a school receiving federal program funds, you have the right to know:

- Is my child's teacher licensed to teach the grades and subject(s) assigned?
- Is my child's teacher teaching with a provisional license, meaning the state has waived requirements for my child's teacher?
- What is the college major of my child's teacher?

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• What degree or degrees does my child's teacher hold?
