

The Magna Award is recognition of the unique collaboration occurring in the Lapwai School District which includes a dedicated school board and administrators, hardworking instructional staff, and close working relationship and support from the Nez Perce Tribe. We work closely with all Tribal departments including Education (S.T.E.P.), Social Services/Child Protection, Tribal Police, and Nimiipuu Behavioral and Community Health. Recently Nez Perce Tribal Police gifted our district with a student resource officer. We continue to partner in the pursuit of grant funding to sustain this critical role. We also have an excellent partnership with the city of Lapwai. City Council, and the late Mayor Ruth McConville, have included support of education in the majority of their grant applications. Mayor McConville had a big heart for our district and loved the students in the community. Together, we ensure all students will reach their full potential.


Average Daily Attendance
