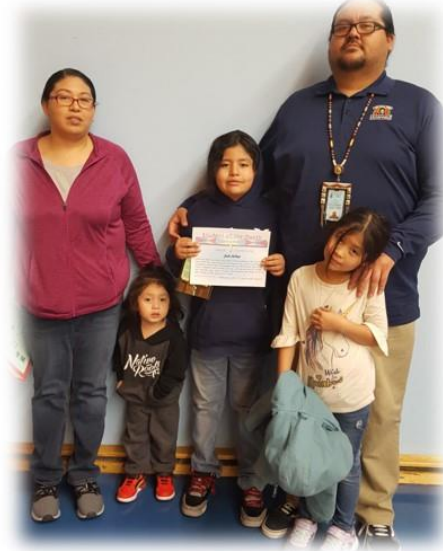

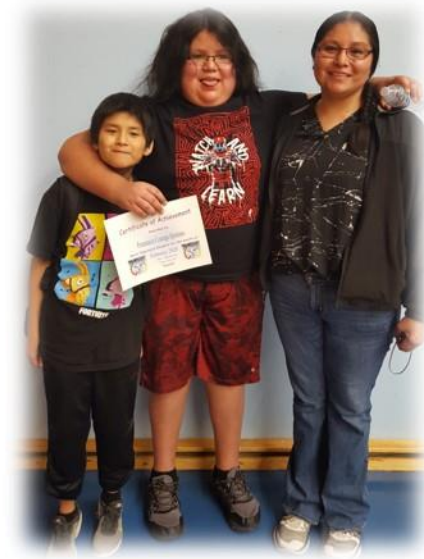

Mrs. Sliger's Kindergarten Handwashing Experts!



Staff are reviewing appropriate handwashing procedures and other health reminders.



The Lapwai School District takes great care to create a safe and supportive learning environment. This includes prevention of the spread of illness.

What can we do to prevent the spread of illnesses at school?

Precautions to Take at Home:

- Stay home when sick waiting until 24 hours after a fever to return.
- Get your influenza vaccine. It's not too late.
- Make sure you are up to date on your vaccinations against Pertussis (DTAP).
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.



The Lapwai School District takes great care to create a safe and supportive learning environment. This includes prevention of the spread of illness.

Schools Will Be Reinforcing the Following Procedures:

- Review appropriate handwashing techniques with students followed by provided hand sanitizer.
- Reinforce covering coughs or sneezes with a bent arm or tissue, washing hands afterward.
- Discourage touching eyes, nose and mouth.
- Discourage the sharing of food and drinks.
- All instructional spaces will be provided anti-bacterial wipes.
- Maintenance will clean high-touch surfaces daily with highly-effective, anti-bacterial products.

"Mat talk" your math talk.
 I'm no math whiz, but if you ask my kids - I'm a math queen. I struggled with math my whole life, even into college. Having kids, I knew I always wanted them to be confident with numbers. Following the model of parenting that I'd like my kids to be better than me - I provided them early with skills to be little mathematicians. (Also, I had some hope that my son was a genius and could use his genius brain to help me pass college math.) No offense to my son, but I passed math on my own. ⁽¹⁾
 Start early with talking numbers and sequences, and talk often. One huge thing that helped my family was bedtime math. We started with a book and moved to the app. This gives you a word problem in three levels. Solving a word problem before bed took two minutes at first, while we were grocery shopping, walking around campus, and timing every single aspect of our life. It seems overwhelming, but start with bedtime math and you'll quickly realize your kids want math and numbers all the time.
 Encourage that, love that and definitely "mat talk" them any chance you get. Hype your kids up in the classroom and celebrate their math success.
