
Mrs. Bateman is among the growing resources in the Lapwai School District to ensure a safe and supportive learning environment. Please join us in celebrating her caring support!

# Bullying Prevention Program









Thank you Mrs. Franke, Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports Coordinator at Lapwai Middle-High School. Mrs. Franke partnered with Mrs. Shaffer's music classes to introduce the EVERFI Honor Code Bullying Prevention Program this week. Honor Code provides students with the skills to recognize the cause and effect of bullying, while building bullying prevention strategies to share with their communities. The program incorporates core elements from the Navy SEALs ethos: Integrity, Responsibility, Loyalty, Respect, Teamwork, Discipline, Selflessness, Leading by Example, Goal Orientation, and Standing up for Others.

Following the bullying prevention program, students will be able to:

- Identify bullying in its major forms: physical, verbal, cyber, and relational
- Understand the roots and triggers of bullying including the implications and effects
- Internalize key traits of the Navy SEAL ethos
- Practice effective ways to stop bullying in schools by supporting others and seeking help
