With the arrival of winter, please remember there are *two* possible responses to hazardous road conditions:

- ❑ School Closure
- ❑ Late Start - 10:00 a.m.

BUS STUDENTS ON A LATE START DAY:

Busses will run 2 hours late - Add two hours to your pick up time

Example: If your pick-up time is normally 7:00 a.m., your late start pick-up time will be 9:00 a.m.



BREAKFAST WILL NOT BE SERVED ON LATE START DAYS

STAFF ARE REQUESTED TO REPORT TO SCHOOL BY 9:30 a.m.
SCHOOL STARTS AT 10:00 a.m.

- Regular and punctual attendance remain crucial on late start days in order to continue the option.
- Please keep your contact information up to date with your child's school to receive school closure notifications.
