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The Lapwai School District is currently implementing Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS). PBIS is a best-practice framework for improving academic and behavioral outcomes for all students. The purpose of this program is to increase academic time-on-task by reducing problem behaviors. The students are explicitly taught how to be respectful, responsible, and safe in all locations on the school grounds. Our goal with PBIS and bullying prevention is to create a safe environment to maximize learning for all students. Ms. Becker and Mr. Walker have big hearts for Lapwai students. 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




