Lockdown drills were practiced districtwide this fall. A Wildcat thank you to Student Officer Bourgeau and the Nez Perce Tribal Police for supporting the drill at Lapwai Middle-High School.

Recent Safety Upgrades Include:

Video doorbell secured entry
Key card access at entries
Improved intercoms and classroom cameras
Teacher lanyards with panic buttons
Radio communication districtwide including busses
Upgrades to bus camera software
Districtwide first aid, CPR, Narcan, and AED training
Vape Detectors

Aides including the Superintendent now ride busses to support drivers


