Join local chef, Rodney Farrington for a fun cooking class where students learn valuable cooking skills and make a delicious recipe.



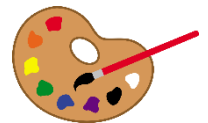
Art Around the World

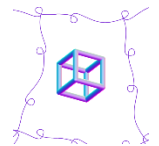
