MYTHS about head lice:

Hair dye will kill bugs and nits (eggs). You only have to treat the hair, not beds or clothing. Lice will go away if you comb them out. One lice treatment is adequate.

FACTS about head lice:

Lice eggs or 'nits' hatch within 1-2 weeks after they are laid. Chemicals cannot penetrate the shells of lice eggs, they must be combed out. Lice are spread by close person-to-person contact.

You must remove lice from your home (Clothing, bed sheets, pillows, stuffed toys must be laundered in hot water/high heat dry or sealed in a plastic bag for 2 weeks. MORE FACTS ABOUT
