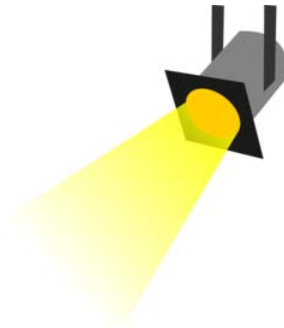


STUDENT SPOTLIGHT
